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Coatesville Marching Red Raiders' Band Camp Survival Guide

Band Camp is one of the most productive parts of the school year as a band program. It is important that you come prepared for band camp and come prepared to work. This information will help you be prepared and, therefore, successful.

MANDATORY ITEMS:

- 1. Mask- Required per CASD safety policy
- 2. <u>Completed Band Packet</u> The papers need to be completed and put in the locked CPMC mail box. The emergency contact form must be in before band camp.
- 3. Water Jug It is very important to stay hydrated! Bring a large (some bring an insulated gallon jug) container of water and/or multiple water bottles frozen the night before to provide cold water during the day as they thaw. During frequent breaks, you will need to drink plenty of water. Avoid CAFFEINE or sugar-loaded drinks. Water and Gatorade/Powerade are best. Soda and juice will dehydrate you. Avoid drinking milk or eating dairy products. The heat will cause it to curdle in your stomach and make you nauseous. Get an insulated jug for water. Don't forget to clean and dry it after each day's practice, so it doesn't gunk up inside.
- 4. <u>Lunch</u> Lunch is the relaxation time of the day, it is not time to play sports or run around. Make sure to bring your lunch in a cooler. Avoid carbonated soda, dairy products, greasy foods, candy and sweets. YOU MAY NOT LEAVE CAMPUS DURING LUNCH OR ORDER FOOD TO BE DELIVERED. (WAWA coupons are available for discounted WAWA shorty hoagies, and to help pay your student account.)
- 5. <u>Drill Book</u> Bring a three ring 1" binder (nothing smaller) to hold all of your warm-ups, music and drill papers. Lots of heavy-duty plastic page covers to hold all the papers you will be given during rehearsals. Also, attach a strap to the binder to hang over your shoulder to carry.
- 6. <u>Highlighters and Mechanical Pencils</u> at least two highlighters of different colors. Use mechanical pencils as there are very few pencil sharpeners outside[©]
- 7. Apparel A light colored t-shirt, comfortable shorts and a hat are required. An extra t-shirt is always good to have. NO JEANS OR LONG PANTS ARE ALLOWED DURING REHEARSAL. It is a serious health risk due to the summer heat. Wear socks and comfortable sneakers. No sandals, flip-flops or high-top shoes will be allowed. All clothing should be school appropriate! It is August in PA... it WILL be hot.
- 8. <u>Sunscreen/Bug Spray</u> (30 SPF or above) Apply the sunscreen BEFORE you come in the morning and reapply throughout the day to prevent sunburn.
- 9. <u>Instrument/Equipment</u> Make sure you have all your instrument parts, such as neck straps, ligature and mouthpieces. Yes, there have been a few that have forgotten this before.
- 10. <u>Miscellaneous Items</u> A blanket or towel to sit on when eating, a hand towel to wipe the sweat off, Chapstick/DCT (made by Blistex) (especially for brass players), deodorant, an asthma inhaler (if needed) and a book bag of some sort to keep things in. Sunglasses keep the UV light from your eyes and make the glare bearable, since you have to look up, sometimes into the sun. A hat will keep the sun out of your eyes and face (preventing "Rocky Raccoon" tan lines around your eyes, which look silly in your school pictures.)
- 11. Participating in marching band and color guard is a privilege (not an entitlement) and requires self-discipline. It is not a singular endeavor and each member plays a very critical part of the performance. If one person does not take personal responsibility to take care of themselves as an athlete and performer and decompensates as a result; the entire team is affected. Take care of yourself! You are very important!

TIPS:

- Remember that everyone is at band camp to learn. If you're a newcomer, don't take it personally when an instructor gives advice. They're trying to help you be a better performer. If you're a returning member, help newcomers and be patient with them. You learned once, too.
- <u>Be clean and use deodorant</u>. You WILL perspire and you WILL need deodorant. Best to be proactive than to be told by new friends that you need a shower and deodorant/antiperspirant. Deodorant helps, and should travel with you somewhere that you can get to it when getting out of a sweaty uniform, later. Remember to take showers after every rehearsal!
- <u>Eat healthy foods!</u> Don't just eat a pop-tart for breakfast on your way out the door; marching is a very physical activity, especially if it's for the entire day. Also remember to eat a healthy lunch. Fried foods aren't good for you anyway, but if you eat unhealthy fast food, you will regret it after marching. The food you eat will be the fuel you will use for your practice and performance.

SPECIFIC ITEMS FOR YOUR SECTION:

Color Guard

- Must wear GREY shirts with black, dark blue or other dark-colored shorts
- White Out
- Pen/Pencil case
- A roll of white 3M electrical tape and a roll of black 3M electrical tape. Must be 3M (not negotiable ©)

Wind Players

- Woodwinds must have your own reeds
- Brass players will need your own valve/slide oil grease

Percussion

- Tape
- Drum sticks
- Metronome

What to Expect at Band Camp:

Expect to work, and work really hard. Expect a suntan or sunburn, with tan lines from your shirt and socks. Most of all, expect to learn the majority of this year's show, have some fun doing it, and expect to be proud of the hard work you put into making the Red Raider Marching Band :one of the best bands around!

What to Do:

There are several things you can do to make band camp a little easier on yourself.

- ✓ **Be on time**: You are responsible for being on time. You cannot blame this on traffic, on car trouble, or on your parents. You take full responsibility for it. Early is on time, on time is late!!!
- ✓ Behave: Just get in line, stay in step, do whatever is asked of you. Mr. Hughes and the techs are not baby sitters. If you work hard they will notice as will your band mates. Also, behaving tends to get things done a lot quicker. There's nothing worse than re-running a drill set over and over again because the band isn't behaving correctly!
- ✓ **Take care of yourself**: Marching band and color guard are strenuous activities as equally rigorous as any team sport. Members must be physically able to fully participate in practice and performance activities in sometimes adverse weather conditions. Minor injuries can occur but can generally be avoided by proper hydration and nutrition as well as attention paid to immediate surrounding area and adherence to instructor direction. Bring any required ankle, knee or wrist braces or wraps. Make sure you bring any prescribed medication required during the day with you to camp. Our band booster medical volunteers provide minor first aid during band camp and are at the rehearsal field with us during the entirety of band camp. They can assist with storage of your EpiPens/prescribed medication as necessary.
- ✓ Keep cool: Both literally and figuratively. Make sure you are not overheating (the intent is not to make anyone sick), but also keep a calm mind. So you can't hit the line the first time you try it? You can't play your part perfectly? That's ok, as long as you keep trying your hardest and listen graciously for advice, you WILL eventually get it!

Final Notes - The Most Important Things To Remember:

- Respect the directors, staff, officers, & upperclassmen (they have done this before and know what they're talking about).
- Keep social distancing.
- Wash your hands often!
- > Eat breakfast EVERY DAY!
- Drink plenty of water or Gatorade during every break (sodas are not allowed during rehearsals).
- > Wear light colored shorts and good running sneakers.
- Wear a hat, sunscreen, and sunglasses.
- > Bring your Instrument and materials each day.

Band camp is hard work, but you will find that working hard and then seeing the results of that hard work is something to really be proud of. Remember, excellence is not just for sometimes, excellence is for all of the time!

The Marching Red Raider Uniform and Other Helpful Information--2021

Coatesville Area Senior High School Provides:

- Band Members: Jacket, Pants, Raincoat and Hat These items will be measured by the band's Uniform coordinator/committee to fit you at Band Camp. You are responsible for taking proper care of these items when in your possession. You will be taught the proper way to fold the pants, hang the jackets and return them to the garment bags and storage racks.
 - **Please note**—The jacket and pants are <u>DRY CLEAN ONLY</u>. CPMC dry cleans all the uniforms before and at least once during the marching season and in special circumstances, for instance: if we've been caught in a rain storm or right before championships. If your student is not responsible with these items (drops it in the mud, spill drinks or drops ketchup, mustard, tomato sauce, etc.), you, the parent, will be responsible for getting the items dry cleaned in time for the next event. Cost to parent for individual cleaning will be approx. \$30-\$50 per uniform, if we must have it cleaned.
- Color Guard: Guard uniform and Raincoat These items will be measured by the
 band's Uniform coordinator/committee to fit you at Band Camp and/or ordered to match your
 measurements. You are responsible for taking proper care of these items when in your possession.
 You must put your track jacket over your uniform when eating and hang the uniform properly in the
 garment bag on the storage rack when not in use. You MAY be required to take your uniform home to
 wash it if you get it dirty.

Coatesville Parents Music Club orders and distributes:

• **ONE band uniform T-shirt** - You must indicate the size needed on the Contact Information and Band Uniform T-shirt Order Form. **If you do not return this form CPMC will order a size Large shirt for you.** This is the T-shirt that must be worn under the band uniform for ALL functions. If you are not wearing **THIS** T-shirt, you are **NOT** in uniform. A new T-shirt is designed each year.

You are responsible for buying the following uniform pieces—

If any of these items are missing, you are not considered in full uniform and will not participate in the event/competition:

• Band Members: Dinkles. Color Guard: Guard Shoes - Dinkles are black marching shoes and Guard Shoes are a tan jazz shoe. If you have Dinkles/Guard Shoes that fit and are in good condition you do NOT need to order a new pair. If you do not have Dinkles/Guard shoes or need new ones, then you will be fitted for them during the first week of Band Camp. Order forms will be distributed at that time and payment is due with your order.

- **Gloves** Color Guard, Pit, and Drumline players do not wear gloves. All other band members need at least one pair of white gloves and one pair of black gloves. Note that Cymbal players wear special gloves. Sabre line of the color guard also have special gloves. Order Forms will be distributed during the first week of band camp.
- Band Members: Black socks. Color Guard: No Show Socks Band members need SOLID black socks that go OVER your ankles. Buy several pairs. Color Guard needs no show socks of any color. They should not be visible when wearing your jazz shoe.
- Hair Ties, Hair nets or Under Armor skull caps Band members must fit ALL hair underneath your marching hat. Please determine which method will work best for you. Color Guard will need hair ties but the hairstyle for performance will be determined during the season.

Warm-up Suits-required to be worn after competitions and is an "out of uniform" uniform.

New students are required to buy one full warm-up suit set. Returning students may order a whole
new set or just the jacket or the pants as needed. The cost is approximately \$80.00 for a full set. The
jacket has Coatesville Music Department logo embroidered on the left chest and the student's last
name embroidered on the right chest and the left hip on the pants. These will be fitted during band
camp. More ordering information will be coming later.

What do I wear under my uniform (Band Only)?

- <u>No cami's, no spaghetti straps, no tank tops</u>. Before the band t-shirt is distributed, a regular black t-shirt with sleeves that cover the shoulders can be worn.
- Besides the REQUIRED uniform and your band T-shirt, most band members wear comfortable shorts, the baggy basketball shorts (mesh), leggings, tights, or even yoga pants. If you wear sweatpants, they MUST NOT be able to be seen protruding from your uniform pants. When it's cold, it is acceptable and encouraged that you wear long sleeved BLACK Under Armor underneath your band T-shirt. You cannot wear hoodies under the uniform—they won't fit, and they aren't allowed.

What happens after performances?

- **Football games** We stay in uniform until after the football game is over. Guard may put layers under their warm up suits but warm up jackets and pants MUST be on the outside of any layers.
- **Competitions IF** there is time, we often will change out of the uniforms after our competition performance is over. Warm-up suits are required, and you should bring any other clothes that you might want with you for warmth and on the bus.

When do we eat?

- **Football games** During football games you will have free time during the 3rd quarter to visit the bathrooms and eat. The band does **NOT** eat in the stands.
- Competitions: Times will vary depending upon performance times.

Food

• Make sure you either bring a lunch/dinner. You may bring money to purchase food and drinks at games and competitions when instructed to do so but remember not all venues will have concessions due to the COVID requirements. Some days we will practice during the morning and afternoons before boarding the buses to leave for competitions. On these days, it is advisable to bring both lunch and dinner (to eat at school or on the way). Times vary for every competition and there may not be time to hit a concession stand at the event. Some competition days the CPMC may provide a lunch in the school cafeteria if permitted by COVID limitations. Please pay attention to announcements and e-mail communications which will let you know what you need to bring with you.

NOTE: All band members and Color Guard will remain together as one group. No one is to leave the group without the consent of the band director and/or a CPMC chaperone. You will be escorted by a staff member and/or a chaperone to concessions, restrooms, buses, etc.

UNDERSTANDING PRACTICE, BAND CAMP, FOOTBALL GAMES AND COMPETITIONS

PRACTICE - SUMMER and FALL

The band practices at the school most of the summer on Monday and Wednesday nights. These practices are mandatory and are strongly encouraged to help keep the students improving with their instruments. Once school starts, practices continue on Monday and Wednesday nights until the competition and football seasons end.

BAND CAMP

Marching Band Camp is held on the campus of the school typically the first two FULL weeks of August. Students will learn how to march, play while marching, play in the outdoor environment, and the importance of team membership to create a musical experience. Students will receive instruction from staff members in marching and playing in both individual and ensemble settings.

Many bonds are formed in the marching band camp. Aside from marching and playing, ideals of trust, responsibility, teamwork, goal setting and achievement, and character are all components of the camp experience.

Marching band camp is mandatory. Band camp is where all the marching band members come together to learn basic marching and music techniques, along with drill (the marching pattern on the field). It is vital for all members to attend Band Camp because we will cover the equivalent of nearly six weeks of regular rehearsal hours in the two weeks of camp. The process of learning marching drill is dependent on the "dots" in the drill being filled...meaning every individual must be there. Without a marcher in attendance, it becomes a hardship to those around him/her to successfully march their drill.

Likewise, promptness to all rehearsals is required, so we may all begin at the same time. <u>Please plan to arrive 15 minutes prior to be ready to begin at the given time.</u> We also ask that all doctor appointments, unless an emergency, not be scheduled during band camp. Attendance and promptness will be documented at each rehearsal per handbook policies. If for any reason you cannot attend a rehearsal, please contact Mr. Hughes.

HOME FOOTBALL GAMES

There are usually five home varsity football games held on Friday nights in the season. The Marching Band cadences into the stadium at 6:15PM. Some games we will perform our competition show before the game. We also play the National Anthem and our Fight Song. We then load the bleachers, where we cheer and play and have a great time during the 1st, 2nd & 4th quarters of the game. If we don't play our show pre-game, then we perform it at halftime and have a 3rd quarter break.

On Homecoming Night and Senior Night, we perform our show after the game rather than during halftime. These times will vary depending on the events of the evening (Middle School Night, Homecoming, Senior Night, etc.). The home football schedule will be posted to our Google Calendar after it is provided to Mr. Hughes.

COMPETITIONS

Performing at competitions is the highlight of our show season! Competitions are held on Saturdays at various schools in the area beginning in mid-September and ending with Championships in Hershey Giant Stadium mid-November. Each of these Saturdays begins with morning rehearsal, followed by lunch. Then we're off to the show traveling by school bus, with the instruments and props loaded up on trucks and trailers. We usually return late Saturday night. An itinerary for each Saturday is provided via email around Wednesday before each show.



Throughout the year, CPMC will organize and manage fundraiser events to earn the money needed to support the Red Raider Marching Band, Indoor Drum Line and Indoor Color Guard programs. Some fundraisers are organized with the intent that the profits that you earn are set aside in a "student account" to offset individual student expenses for which parents/guardians are responsible. Those expenses include membership fees, extra t-shirts, sweatshirts, and the band banquet. Other fundraisers or events are organized to benefit the general funds of the CPMC which directly support the marching band and indoor programs such as instructor salaries, performance props, dry cleaning uniforms and maintenance of equipment.

What expenses are allowed to be paid from my student account?

- The membership fee for the Outdoor Marching season
- The membership fee for the Indoor Drum Line or Indoor Guard season

•

If your account has a credit balance the credit balance may be used to pay for:

- The band banquet ticket cost
- Extra band t-shirts
- Sweatshirts
- Warm-up Suits
- Extended Travel Fees

NOTE: Student Account funds may not be requested to be withdrawn by a student or family member for personal use. Credits are applied against the overall balance owed. Student Account Statements will be issued monthly during the school year. Please pay off outstanding balances as soon as possible or alert the Treasurer or Band Director, if you need to make special payment arrangements. We want these activities to be accessible to all students, but we cannot run a quality program without sufficient funding. We have a PayPal account on website for ease of payment or checks can be made to 'Coatesville Parents Music Club' or 'CPMC'. All payments must be submitted in a sealed envelope with the students name on the outside of the envelope and the payment purpose i.e. dues, warm-up suit, specific fundraiser etc. All payments should be deposited in the locked CPMC mailbox.

What happens to the account at the end of the school year—June 2022?

If you are an underclassman and will be participating in a 2022-2023 music program, the funds remain in your account and are carried over.

If you are not going to participate in a 2022-2023 music program the funds in your account are returned to the general funds of the CPMC.

What happens if I graduate in June 2022 and there is still money in my student account?

You may request in writing to the CPMC Treasurer **before** you graduate that you wish to transfer your remaining funds to one or more of your brothers or sisters participating in the music program(s).


If you do **not** transfer the money to a sibling, the money returns to the general funds of CPMC.

What happens if I quit band after participating in a fundraiser that benefitted my student account?

If you quit after participating in a fundraiser that benefitted your student account the funds will first be used to pay any outstanding obligations you may have, and then any remaining funds will be returned to the CPMC general funds.

The rules above are set to allow you to raise money to offset the expenses of participating in the band and indoor groups, but with the realization that <u>all fundraising</u> is for the benefit of the CPMC which in turn uses the funds solely to supports these groups.

CLEARANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR VOLUNTEERS

Volunteers play a vital role in supporting the staff, students, and programs of our schools in the Coatesville Area School District. We are truly very thankful that you have expressed an interest in volunteering in our district.

A Coatesville Area School District Volunteer is defined as an individual who provides a service to students, staff or school/district operations without compensation. All volunteers in the school district who will be responsible for a child's welfare or will have direct volunteer contact with children on a regular and repeated basis will be required to submit all three of the following clearances/certifications:

- Report of Criminal History from the Pennsylvania State Police (PSP)

- Pennsylvania Child Abuse History Clearance
 - https://www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis
- One of the following (see below for more information)
 - Act 24 Certification Form [PDE-6004] (included in this packet)
 - Report of Federal Criminal History https://www.pa.cogentid.com

An Act 24 Certification form may be provided in lieu of the Report of Federal Criminal History (fingerprinting) for those volunteers who have lived continuously within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for the last 10 years or individuals who have resided in Pennsylvania for less than 10 years but have obtained a federal fingerprint check at some point since they started residing in PA. Volunteers who have lived outside the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in the last 10 years or who have not had a federal fingerprint check since moving into the Commonwealth will need to complete the Federal Criminal History (fingerprinting).

In accordance with the Child Protective Services Law, all volunteers must obtain new clearances/certifications every 60 months.
